Mt Agung, Indonesia, Erupts Again

Bali's Mt Agung volcano has erupted again. Volcanic ash is a serious safety concern for aircraft and is dangerous to breathe. The airport is closed, forcing flight cancellations.

This means that Chubb will treat any claims related to volcanic activity, from policies purchased after 5pm on 29 June 2018, as 'foreseen' and therefore not covered.
